'Richmond, Hawkesbury: Andrew Town's Place'

Self drive and walking tour

Meet at 122 Windsor St. Offering a glimpse of a forgotten lifestyle from Victorian times in one of NSW's oldest districts, this guided tour explores the Richmond area's heritage fabric, 1840s - 1890s, in the context of the life of Andrew Town, one of the most famous of all horse breeders. It includes visits to Andrew Town's house, Inn locations and historic St Peters Cemetery as well as introducing his famous stud farm "Hobartville". Bring picnic lunch, for those without a car, transport may be arranged.
